### COLLEGE PROFILE

Guru Nanak Dev University College, Verka was established as a constituent college of Guru Nanak Dev University in 2011. It is a co-educational college. The administrative functioning of the college is regulated by Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar. It is situated in the lush green surroundings of the countryside away from the din of the city. It is located between the Amritsar-Jalandhar by-pass and Amritsar-Batala bypass. It has a sprawling campus covering 15 acres of land donated by Mushtarqa Malikan Committee of the village Verka. The people of Verka would be remembered for this act forever. The constituent colleges were set up to bring higher education within the reach of the people of remote rural areas, so that maximum benefit reaches the less privileged and the needy.



The college will scale new heights under the able guidance of Dr. Jaspal Singh Sandhu, the present Vice-Chancellor of Guru Nanak Dev University. He has visionary zeal for academic excellence and under his leadership; the college will certainly reach the pinnacle of educational eminence. The College is covered under the 2(F) & 12(B) scheme of the UGC. As a result, it is entitled to receive financial support from the Central government, the government of Punjab and the UGC. The College has been given BVOC Courses also by the UGC. The teaching fraternity of college is highly

qualified and dedicated who constantly strive for their growth as well as for the holistic development of their students. For this purpose, both academic as well as extra curricular activities are conducted as a regular feature of curriculum. The students of this college have brought laurels by winning many online inter college competitions. Similarly, the teachers keep working for the pursuit of excellence in their respective fields. Many teachers have been promoted to the next stage under Career Advancement scheme of UGC. The teachers have presented papers and delivered lectures as Resource Persons in many national and international conferences and seminars. The teaching staff regularly attends faculty development programmes to remain updated and is also actively engaged in research work.

















#### **INFRASTRUCTURE**

The College is housed in a double storied 'H' shaped building and has two wings. These two wings have been subdivided into blocks which are 'U' shaped. The newly constructed building with 45 spacious, airy, well lit classrooms is conducive for academic pursuits. It is friendly for the physically challenged persons, the ramp having been built particularly for this purpose. The two wings of the college have Arts, Science, Computers and Commerce faculties. The College has a well stocked library, a scholarship cell, NSS room & NCC office. There are well equipped laboratories, two each for Physics & Chemistry, one Fashion Designing Lab, one Psychology Lab, one Geography Lab, one Botany Lab & one Zoology Lab. There is a conference hall on the ground floor besides which is located the Administrative block. The other wings have Arts and ICT streams. The two wings are conjoined through two corridors. The ramp serves as a passage for reaching the upper building via the middle corridor. It helps to fulfill the requirements under Sugamya Bharat Abhiyan for the benefit of the physically challenged persons. The other corridor joins the Administrative block and the ICT wing. An overhead water tank meets requirement for the provision of clean water. There is also a security room beside the main gate for the security personnel. A boundary wall with barbed wire has been built around the entire college building to provide secure environment in the college. To further strengthen the security of the campus, CCTV cameras have also been installed.

## College Rules

#### It is mandatory for all the students of this college to follow the following rules:

- 1. If a student remains absent continuously for 15 days from his/her class without informing the Principal, his/her admission will be cancelled.
- 2. Without college Identity Card, no student will be allowed to enter in the college premises.
- 3. The students are expected to sit in the classroom before the arrival of teacher and they have to maintain the decorum of the class.
- 4. It is prohibited to stand, shout and roam in groups in the corridors.
- 5. Respect each other at all times. Disagreements will be settled by discussing the problem and seeking a solution that is fair to all concerned.
- 6. The College campus should be kept clean. Do not deface or damage college property. The students, who vandalize the college property, will be punished.
- 7. Maintain order when moving to different areas.
- 8. The Political activities are banned in the campus.
- 9. All expressions or activities which are immoral, antisocial, communal and anti-national are strictly prohibited in the college campus.
- 10. Avoid using abusive or profane language and gestures.
- 11. Do not climb trees, gates, railing and fences of the college building.
- 12. Buying & selling of personal items and trading is not allowed.
- 13. The students must park their vehicles only in the space allotted. They should not bring four wheelers to the campus as they arrive for classes.
- 14. The college campus is a no-smoking and alcohol-free zone.
- 15. The students are prohibited to use mobile phones within the campus. Photography in the college premises is not allowed.
- 16. The students found guilty of ragging will be dismissed from the college.
- 17. The students must leave the premises immediately after college duties/responsibilities

are over.

18. Absenteeism should be strictly avoided.

#### **House Examination Rules**

- 1. House examination (MST) will be conducted according to the guidelines provided by the university and these exams are mandatory for every student.
- 2. If a student remains absent in house exams without informing the concerned authority, heavy fine will be imposed on him/her.
- 3. If a student will not be able to take house tests due to an unavoidable circumstance, in that case the Principal reserves the right to grant or refuse re-test to him/her.

#### **Rules regarding University examination:**

- 1. A student must get minimum 35% marks in each subject or aggregate 25% marks in house exams to be eligible for University examination.
- 2. Minimum 75% of attendance is mandatory for every student to be eligible to take University exams. Same is applicable for practical subjects also.
- 3. If a student fails to fulfil the minimum eligibility conditions, he/ she will not be able to claim for University Roll number. Such students can be debarred from sitting in the University examination.

#### **Leave Rules:**

- 1. No Student should be absent without obtaining prior permission from their Incharge.
- 2. No student will be allowed to take leave of more than three days. In an unavoidable situation, leave must be got sanctioned from the Principal before it is availed of.
- 3. Application for leave must be signed by the father or the guardian of the applicant.
- 4. For sick leave of more than three days, the application should be supported by the medical certificate.

## ADMISSION RULES



According to University Calendar Volume-II Ordinances 2008, norms issued by Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar regarding admission and examination are as follows:

- 1. The students seeking admission to the college are required to submit the following documents at the time of admission:
  - I. 2 photocopies of DMCs for lower examination.
  - II. Original DMCs for the purpose of verification.
  - III. Migration certificate in Original (Except PSEB)
  - IV. A character Certificate in Original from the institution last attended.
  - V. 3 passport size photographs of the student and one passport size photograph of each parent separately.

#### VI. Copy of Aadhar Card VII. Residence Certificate

- 2. It is mandatory for the students (other than PSEB) to submit their original DMC of 10th and 12th class at the time of admission.
- 3. False information provided by a student in the university prescribed admission form will lead to the cancellation of his/her admission.
- 4. Those students whose results are declared late by GNDU Amritsar or any other recognized university / Board can seek admission only if seats are available in class/course or with the permission of university.

- SC/ST/OBC/Minority students are required to submit their original category certificates as well as low income certificate (recent) in a prescribed format as per the norms of Punjab Government / GNDU Amritsar.
- 6. The students availing scholarship will have to submit 3 photocopies of Aadhar Card, Parents' Aadhar Cards Residence Certificate, Bank Account Passbook seeded with Aadhar (along with IFSC code), Application Form, Freeship Card, Income Certificate Caste Certificate & 2 passport size photographs.
- 7. If a student availing scholarship fails in the university examination, then he/she will not be able to get scholarship for the same class again. In that case he/she will have to pay full amount of admission as well as each university examination fee with fine and charges.
- 8. Those students whose results are declared by GNDU Amritsar or any other recognised university/board can seek admission to the higher class within 10 working days (including two transit days) of the date of notification of the result without late fees, provided seats are available in class/courses.
- 9. The students with compartment in 10+2 must clear their compartments before 31st December 2023. Otherwise they won't be permitted to appear in the exam. Fee will not be refunded.

#### CODE OF CONDUCT



- The Students are expected to maintain discipline, regularity, and punctuality.
- In their dealing with members of staff, fellow students, visitors, the clerical staff and class IV employees, they are expected to behave gently and politely.
- The students must help in keeping the college campus and their class-rooms neat and clean. They must make use of dust bins for throwing pieces of wastepaper & peels etc.
- "THE COLLEGE IS OURS", the students are to develop this feeling in their mind and help in keeping the college property in good shape.
- They should not tamper with electricity fittings and must

- switch off the fans and lights before leaving the class room.
- No student is allowed to use the name of college in any publication or outside activity without prior permission of the Principal.
- The students are not allowed to write anything whatsoever on the Notice Board, Walls of the Building, Doors and Windows.
- Use of mobile phones in the campus by the students is strictly prohibited.
- The students can not leave the college before 12:30 pm.

## IMPLEMENTATION OF NEP - 2020 FROM THE CURRENT SESSION

#### The major recommendations regarding NEP-2020 are as under:-

- 1. All the Three-Year Bachelor Programmes except Bachelor of Vocational and employment-oriented professional courses (as per Punjab Govt. Memo No. 602846:DPIHE-COLS/16/2023-COLEDU-DPI-HE/1/777787/224 dated 07.02.2024) will be converted into Four-year UG Honors Degree Programmes under NEP 2020 with exit option after three years and entry option into fourth year.
- 2. Three Value added courses (VACs) i.e. "Drug Abuse: Problem, Management and Prevention", "Environmental Studies" and "Human Rights and Constitutional Duties" will be offered in 1st year, 2nd year and 3rd year, respectively, of the 4-year UG Degree Programme. Each student is required to complete all the three VACs each year during first three years of undergraduate degree program.
- 3. Professional programmes where English and Punjabi are taught only in First year (Semester 1, 2) will remain same and credit in further semesters will be used for other subjects.
- 4. Each student is required to complete one Ability Enhancement course(AEC) each year during first three years of undergraduate degree program.
- 5. Each student is required to complete one Multidisciplinary course(MDC) each year during first three years of undergraduate degree program.
- 6. Each student is required to complete one Skill Enhancement course(SEC) each year during first three years of undergraduate degree program.
